David Lloyd

David Lloyd is the Director of the Family Advocacy Program (FAP) in the Office of the Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Military Community and Family Policy. In this capacity, Mr. Lloyd is responsible for policy development and budget support of the FAPs in the military departments that address the prevention, intervention, and treatment of domestic violence and child abuse in the military community worldwide. His duties include implementation of recommendations by the Defense Task Force on Domestic Violence, participation on a federal interagency working group on teen dating violence, and serving as liaison to the Centers for Disease Control in the implementation of the National Intimate Partner and Sexual Violence Surveillance System.

Mr. Lloyd was previously the Director of the National Center on Child Abuse and Neglect within the Administration for Children and Families at the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). While at HHS, he helped develop the first HHS program initiative addressing the co-occurrence of child abuse and domestic violence in families and served on a departmental steering group implementing the Violence Against Women Act.

Mr. Lloyd received his bachelor's degree *cum laude* in international relations from The American University and his law degree from Georgetown University Law Center. He also served in the U.S. Army from 1970-1973, and was a Peace Corps volunteer in Ethiopia from 1968-1970.

Susan J. McCutcheon

Dr. Susan McCutcheon is Director of Family Services, Women's Mental Health, and Military Sexual Trauma, for the Office of Mental Health Services in the Veterans Health Administration of the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).

Dr. McCutcheon began her career with the Veterans Health Administration in 1983. During that time, she has held various administrative and clinical positions. Prior to assuming her current position at VA, she was the Director for Community Mental Health at the Cleveland, Ohio VA Medical Center. Dr. McCutcheon serves on numerous committees and recently has completed a three-year term as a board member of the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) of Ohio. In 2001, she was selected as a Robert Wood Johnson Executive Nurse Fellow and in 2005, she was selected to participate in Leadership VA. Dr. McCutcheon received the Cleveland Federal Executive Employee Recognition Award from the Cleveland Federal Executive Board and the Mental Health Professional of the Year from the National Alliance of the Mentally Ill (NAMI), Metro Cleveland for her contributions to the mental health care of veterans.
