Stepping Up for Kids: what government and communities should do to support kinship families



1. INCREASE FINANCIAL STABILITY FOR KINSHIP FAMILIES

- Ensure kinship families have access to benefits for which they are eligible
 - Access to TANF, SNAP, Social Security, Medicaid, EITC, etc.
 - Importance of Kinship Navigator Programs
- Design TANF-funded programs that meet the unique needs of kinship care families
 - TANF grant levels that better reflect cost of raising children
 - Increase asset limits, remove work requirements, waive time limits
 - Better coordinate TANF and child welfare programs

2. STRENGTHEN KINSHIP FAMILIES INVOLVED IN THE CHILD WELFARE SYSTEM

- Align public child welfare agency and court practices with philosophy of placing children with kin
- Ensure any decision to divert children to live with kin as alternative to state custody is guided by sound policy and practice
- Reform foster home licensing requirements
- Add subsidized guardianship as permanency option for all children in foster care

3. ENHANCE OTHER COMMUNITY-BASED AND GOVERNMENT RESPONSES FOR KINSHIP FAMILIES

- Community and government systems must come together to develop coordinated network of services for kinship families:
 - Stable housing
 - Affordable legal representation
 - Access to health care
 - School enrollment
 - Community-based support
