Maternal and Child Health

- A woman dies every **two minutes** due to pregnancy related causes
- **270,000** women die each year from cervical cancer
- **3,000** women and **1,000** children are newly infected with HIV every day
- Nearly **7 million** children will die this year before they reach their 5th birthday

When a mother dies, her children are more likely to die within two years of her death.

But when a mother survives, her children will survive. Her family will remain intact, communities will be stronger, countries will be secure and our world will be better.

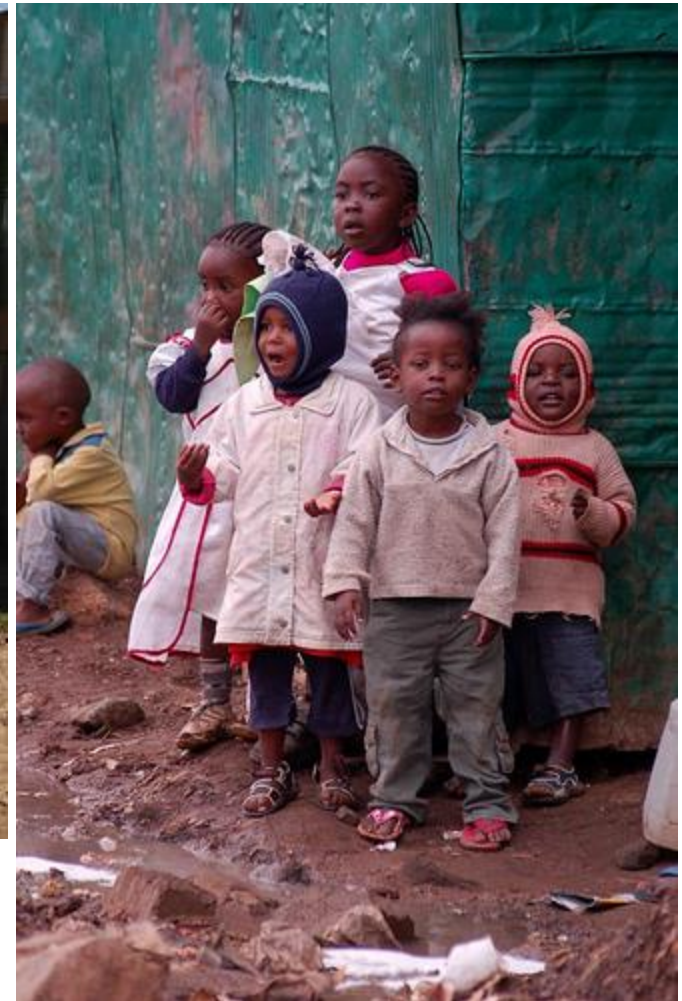
