Spotlight on Women in Public Policy

In 2018, WCPI continued its efforts to expand women's leadership in public policy through its women Members of Congress, chiefs of staff, and congressional fellows programs.



Women Members of Congress

We have been a resource for the women Members of Congress and their staffs since our inception 24 years ago. At a time when partisan rancor is high, WCPI worked to bring women policymakers together across party lines.

Among our 2018 events, we sponsored our annual Take Our Daughters to Congress Day with Girls Inc. in April, a policy briefing on sexual harassment in June, and a September reception to honor the women Members of Congress leaving Congress at the end of the session and thank them for their many years of service.

We also paused to remember the late Rep. Louise Slaughter (D-NY), who passed away in March, and former Ambassador and Rep. Margaret Heckler (R-MA), who passed away in August.



The first woman to chair the House Rules Committee, Rep. Slaughter co-chaired the Women's Caucus during the 108th Congress. The only microbiologist serving in Congress and a longtime champion for women's health, she was a leader in the establishment of the Office of Research on Women's Health (ORWH), the inclusion of women and minorities in clinical trials, and breast cancer research.

Amb. Heckler was a co-founder and co-chair of the Women's Caucus. During her tenure, she sponsored the 1974 Equal Credit Opportunity Act, and championed the Equal Rights Amendment and Title IX. After leaving Congress, she served as Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services, and later as Ambassador to Ireland.



Women Chiefs of Staff Program

Funded by a grant from [Democracy Fund](#), WCPI has been administering the [Women Chiefs of Staff program](#) for three years. We are proud to have fostered bipartisan and bicameral relationships among women chiefs of staff, committee staff directors, and senior leadership staff. We held a number of events in 2018, and are excited to continue this partnership into the 116th Congress.

Congressional Fellowships on Women and Public Policy



We hosted our fifth class of fellows this year! The Congressional Fellowships on Women and Public Policy program provides a unique fellowship – the only graduate-level fellowship on Capitol Hill focused on women – with policymaking and legislative experience.

The Class of 2018 included five fellows who worked in House offices from January through July on a wide range of policy issues. We celebrated the class at our annual reception in June and are grateful for the support of foundation, corporate, academic, and individual [sponsors](#) who make the program possible.
